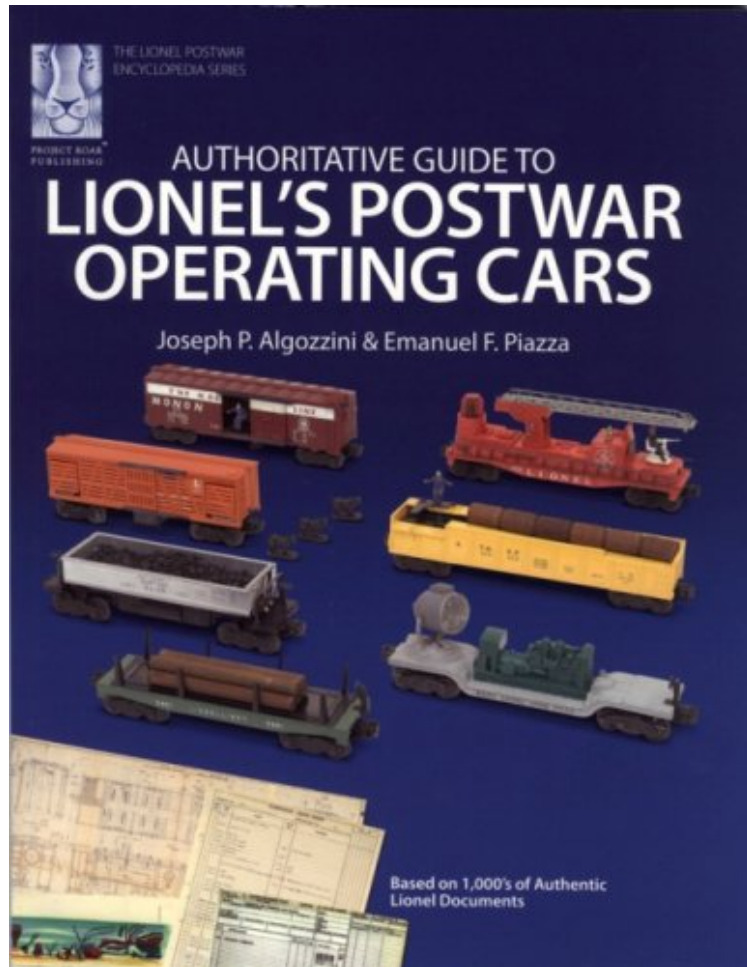

As a member of the TCA Standards committee, he has helped increase the level of awareness and importance of original postwar items. Emanuel F. Piazza has been a collector of Lionel trains since the late 1960s and is also a leading postwar historian. He is a contributor to Lionel's Postwar F3's and has written articles for Classic Toy Trains magazine. He is a past president of the Midwest Division of the Train Collectors Association. Roger Carp has been a member of the editorial staff of Classic Toy Trains magazine since 1988 and now holds the position of senior editor.
