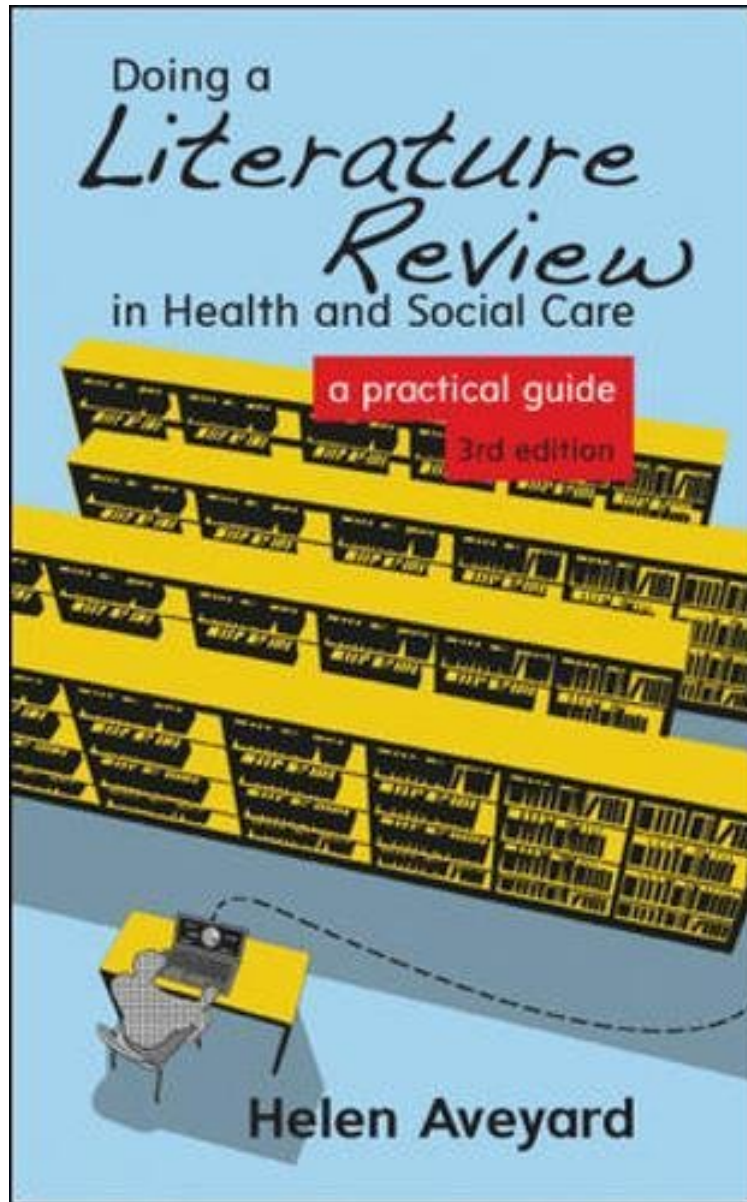

This is a good basic book on producing a literature review. Clearly aimed at undergraduates with no previous experience in assessing research reports, it adopts a cookbook approach, which is clearly what its intended readership wants. It advocates transparency in reporting how the articles to be reviewed were selected, and strongly suggests using one or other of the "tools" available on the web for evaluating individual research reports. It is on rather firmer ground when describing the assessment of quantitative research than when assessing reports of qualitative research. It advocates becoming familiar with the various forms of qualitative research, which it describes sketchily, without suggesting any differences in the approach one might adopt to them. Similarly, it covers the treatment of theoretical literature rather sketchily. Overall: a good book for beginners
