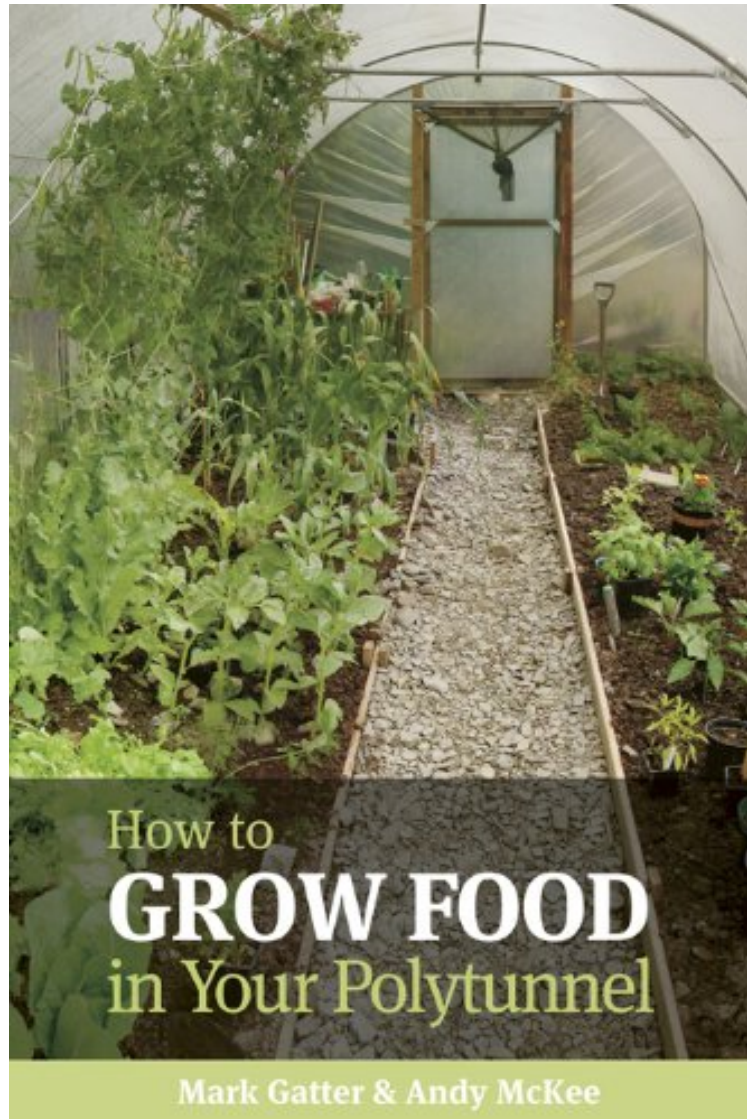

It is a decent book, several of the vegetables are labeled as what I would call "UK" labels meaning I had to look up the name and get the "American" name. I am still looking for that "one" book that I can keep in my home library that will answer everything I want to know. If I would have checked this book out at a library before I purchased it, I would not have purchased it.
